Employment Opportunity – Stabilization Unit Manager

MMPHL seeks a Stabilization Unit Manager to oversee and implement a Substance Use Stabilization Unit (SUSU) pilot project to serve our First Nation communities and surrounding area. The unit will provide short-term residential withdrawal management (non-medical) and therapeutic support to a small group of participants withdrawing from substances and awaiting longer-term residential treatment. A professional designation and registration with the respective college and being a member in good standing is required. Nursing is preferred, but not necessary and other disciplines will be considered.

Qualifications:

- Registered and licensed to practice in Manitoba with applicable professional college and being a member in good standing (e.g. Nursing, Social Work, or Occupational Therapy).
- Demonstrate working knowledge of withdrawal management stabilization procedures in a residential setting and Harm Reduction principles.
- Management and program development experience are an asset.
- Capacity to provide non-judgemental and compassionate care to individuals coping with substance use issues.
- Proven ability to work in crisis and be able to apply policy and procedures as they relate.
- Must be able to function independently, be flexible and adapt quickly to change.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Competent in using computer programs (Microsoft Word, Excel, Outlook, etc.)
- Must have excellent interpersonal skills e.g. problem solving, solution focused, conflict resolution.
- Must be able to demonstrate how you lead a positive and healthy lifestyle (indicate in cover letter and/or references).
- Demonstrated enthusiasm for ongoing professional development activities and engagement in reciprocal learning experiences with colleagues, supervisors and employees.
- Knowledge and experience in traditional and contemporary healing practices.
- Shift will be days, and specific hours may be negotiable.
- Valid Class 5 driver's license.
- Current and valid CPR and Emergency First Aid certification required.
- Current Non-Violet Crisis Intervention training and Mental Health First Aid certification would be an asset.

Qualified candidates will be required to undergo a criminal record check and child abuse registry check. Salary is dependent on education and related experience.
